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SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Participants receive scholarships to support completion of either the:

Master of Science (MS) in Communication Sciences and Disorders (CDIS), leading to a Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) Credential, ASHA SLP certification, and California SLP license

Master of Arts in Learning and Teaching (MALT), leading to a Mild-Moderate Support Needs (MMSN) Education Specialist Credential

Transdisciplinary Educational And Multicultural/Multilingual Approaches for Teaching Elementary Students - Language & Literacy (TEAMMATES-LL) scholars enrolled in either program receive specialized training in implementing scientifically based and culturally responsive language and literacy assessments and interventions with children in local elementary schools, with an emphasis on family and community engagement.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- We welcome applicants from diverse backgrounds; students from minoritized and under-represented backgrounds are especially encouraged to apply. U.S. citizenship is required per DOE regulations.
- Candidates with bilingual and/or bidialectal skills (in Spanish or African American English) are especially encouraged to apply.
- The University of Redlands is a federally designated Hispanic Serving Institution and is committed to promoting best practices in diversity, equity and inclusion for all community members.
- Applicants must be committed to supporting language and literacy development in elementary-school students with special instructional needs. Scholars commit to a three-year (MMSN) or four-year (CDIS) minimum service obligation of employment in a public school district within San Bernardino or Riverside counties, following the completion of the program.
